

Rogue Nation: How Many PDF Tools Occupy Your Workplace?

Introduction

Redundant software solutions have a tendency to accumulate at organizations. Separate divisions, departments or companies that have been acquired may use myriad applications to solve their own unique business needs, unaware that another group already licenses a similar or related solution. As a result, some large companies may end up with more than 5 to 8 different PDF applications within their organization with the goal to reduce that to one standarized solution which fits every user's need. This example may sound extreme, but many companies face similar challenges.

It isn't always apparent that some applications share the same capabilities, especially when these applications are licensed across large-scale organizations. As such, rogue licenses can often slip under IT's radar.

This scenario often occurs with PDF editor tools and applications. There are numerous vendors that provide full-functionality PDF editors, and many line of business solutions include simplified PDF features. Imagine how easy it is for a department to adopt a specific application for document sharing, workflow or storage, not knowing that another department recently addressed the same or similar need. Both may have successfully solved that group's problems but with entirely different applications, each with its own benefits and limitations

So why does it matter? Consider these long-term disadvantages.

IT costs and resources. It is always in IT's best interests to manage the cost and resource allocation associated with application licenses. The cost of multiple applications can add up quickly from the burden of installing to managing and maintaining updates, support and training. Then there is security—how many of these applications present potential threats that require monitoring?

These costs increase over time, especially if one application could have potentially addressed all of an organization's PDF needs.

Overpaying for a solution. Sometimes, organizations will overpay for an application with features they don't necessarily require in an effort to fill an immediate need. This may happen as individuals or small departments make investments on their own or frequently when procurement processes emphasize brand recognition or best value per license rather than which application will perform best based on current requirements.

This approach can lead to higher than necessary costs and investments due to the different number of PDF applications you have to manage. Furthermore, these licenses can be challenging to audit, becoming more expensive and leading to the threat of unplanned usage fees and fines. If PDF seats become limited, the organization may have to choose which employees have access and which do not, and that can lead to lower employee productivity, inflated costs or both.



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Unforeseen technical issues. Some companies may choose a less expensive PDF tool only to find it is no longer compatible with their software applications or that the external PDF documents that they receive and files that they send cannot be opened or lack accurate formatting. Relying on a mishmash of freeware and cheap tools can ultimately lead to compatibility headaches, introduce long-term security concerns as hackers try to infiltrate systems and the inevitability that this approach will eventually become obsolete to a growing organization. Better to choose a proven solution from a reliable provider that will stand the test of time.

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Quality control. No two PDF solutions are created equal or tuned to the same output quality. This means the whole company produces potentially bespoke PDFs with different OCR accuracy, formats and compression rates, ultimately leading to poor search results, inconsistent document quality and document storage issues.
