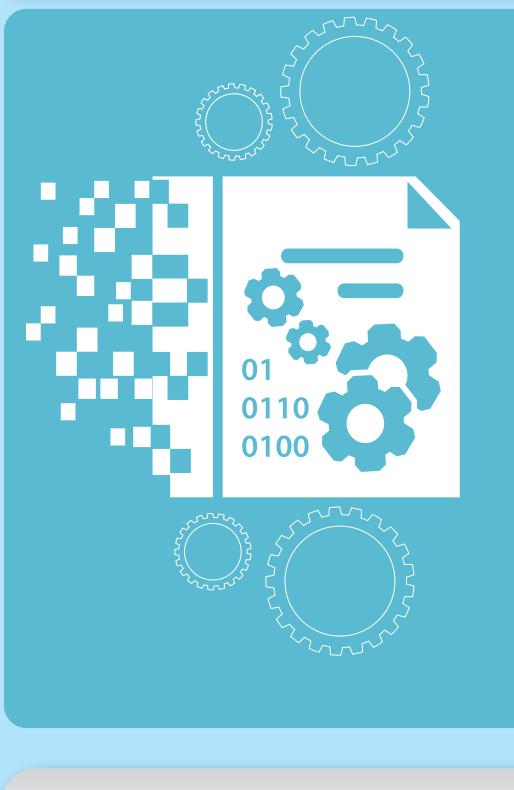

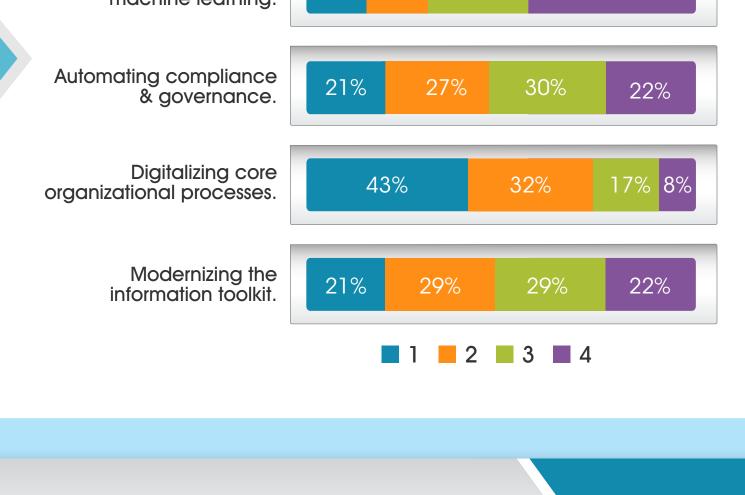

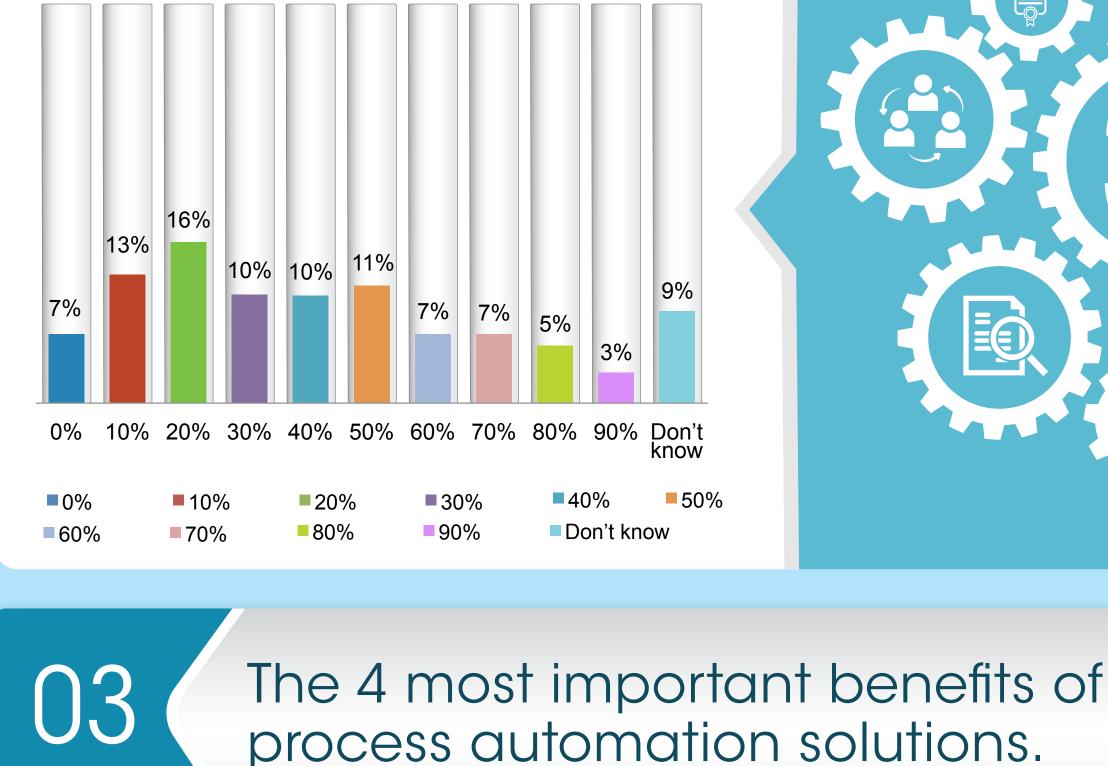

What proportion (an estimate is OK!) of your core business processes would you say are automated today?

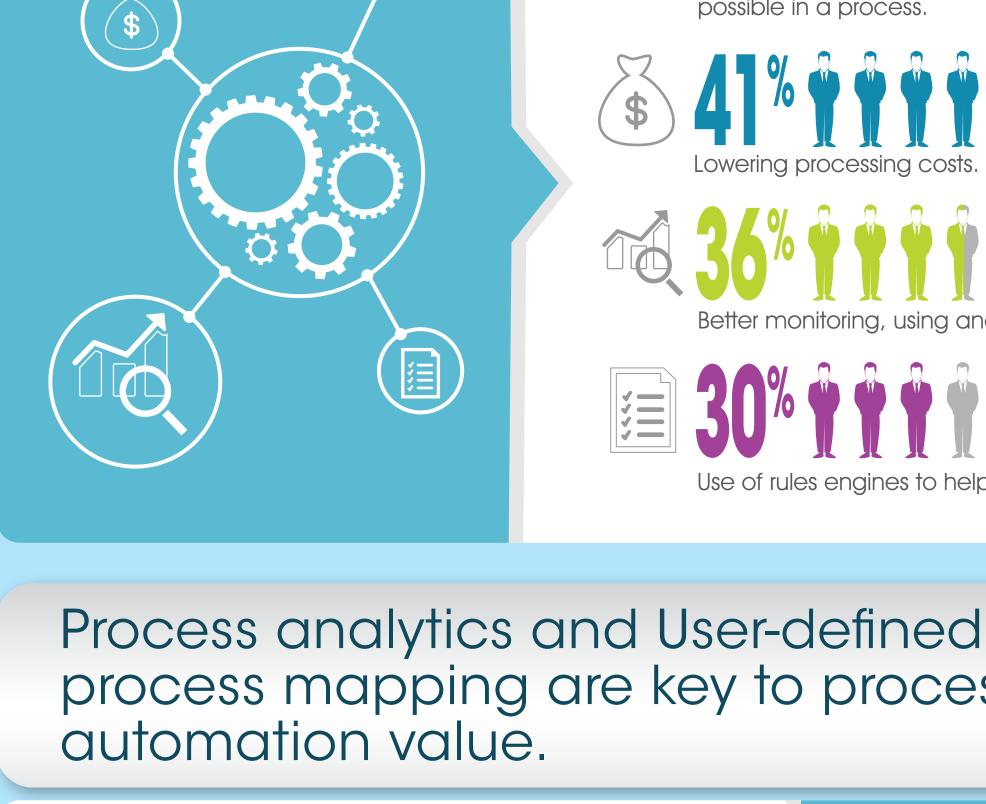

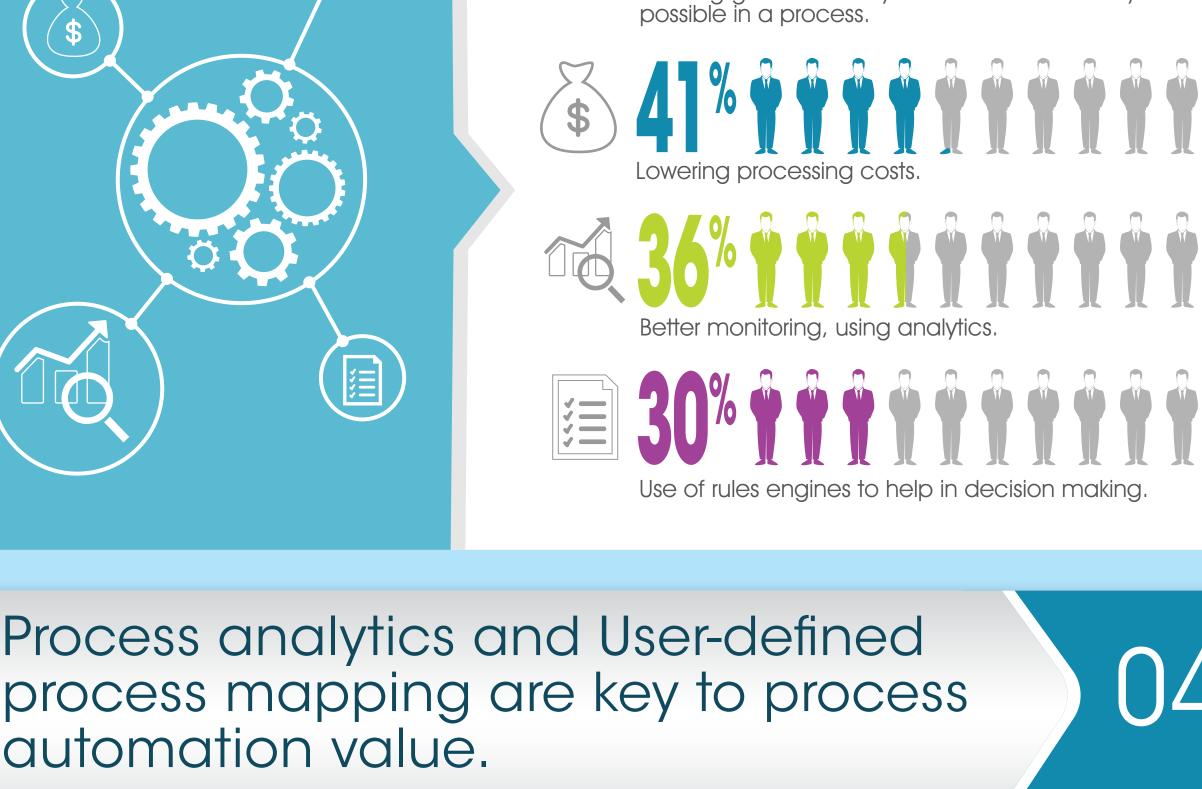
